## **Minutes of meeting of Committee for Scrutiny & Evaluation of Proposals (CSEP) of IFS BWT on 14.06.2026**

The meeting was held by circulation of the agenda item in the 'IFS-CSEP Whatsapp group. the proposal was posted at 4.50 pm by the Vice Chairman of the Committee, requesting members to share their thoughts by 8 pm on 14.06.2026. Following members expressed their views by the scheduled time:

In the absence of Chairman of the Committee Sh. Ashok Pai, IFS Retd., Sh. Surendra Kumar initiated the process. The context of the meeting was already circulated as mentioned in the letter of PCCF Odisha. The gist is again reiterated.

## **2. Proposal under consideration**

- The present proposal relates to the assistance to be given to Ms. Rashmita Subudhi, Forest Guard, Malkangiri Division, Odisha, who met with a severe accident on the night of 12th June 2026 while returning home after patrolling duty. Ms. Subudhi sustained grievous, life-altering injuries and is fighting for her life in the ICU at Apollo Hospital, Visakhapatnam.
- **Nature of Injuries:**
  - Left hand amputated due to the severity of the impact.
  - Spinal and Neck Injuries: Displacement and cracks in the spinal cord region, along with a fractured neck bone.
  - Multiple fractures in ribs and vertebral bones.
  - Internal complications: Blood clotting in her lungs.
- PCCF & HoFF, Odisha, Dr. K. Murugesan, IFS, vide letter dated 14.06.2026, has confirmed that the incident occurred while Ms. Rashmita Subudhi was

returning from patrolling duty and has recommended the case for financial assistance, noting the enormous emotional and financial burden on her family.

- The rapidly escalating medical expenses are far beyond the financial means of the family. The emotional toll on the family is unimaginable.

The Committee considered the above proposal and found it a fit case for providing financial assistance, given the severity of the injuries, the incapacitation of the forest guard in the line-of-duty, and the financial vulnerability of the family.

**The Committee recommends immediate financial assistance of Rs. 2.5 lakh to Ms. Rashmita Subudhi from the Indian Forest Service Benevolent and Welfare Trust, New Delhi, to help cover her medical treatment expenses and ease the burden on her family.**
